

# Honors Student Mentor Program Application

## Mission Statement:

"The collective energy of our honors student mentors is devoted to helping incoming students become adjusted, acclimated, and successful."

## All mentors will be required to:

- Enroll in the AFLS 401VH course (variable credit 1-3 hours).
- Devote 3 hours weekly to attending class on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- Foster a mentoring relationship based in academic skills building.
- Meet with mentees a minimum of 3 times outside the scheduled class time during the semester.

## Lead Mentor Job Description

Two lead mentor positions are available. Lead mentors will be responsible for:

- Serving as liaison between the mentor group and program supervisors.
- Assisting in developing breakout activities (in-class and out-of-class) for incoming freshmen.
- Keeping a close pulse on the atmosphere of the mentor group, and reaching out to mentors as they need guidance, etc.

## Mentor Job Description

Five to six mentor positions are available. Mentors will be responsible for:

- Aiding students with refining academic skills
- Facilitating discussions and break-out activities in class
- Creating engaging group activities both in and out of class that will enable mentees to tackle issues relevant to the first year college student experience.
- Embodying and conveying a sense of professionalism and academic success
